He also went on to say that in Washington State the return on investment for the apprentice is \$91 back and for every dollar the taxpayers of this state put in, they get \$23 back.

SPECIAL REPORTS: Military Transition

- Director Lourdes (Alfie) Alvarado-Ramos, Director, Washington State Department of Veterans Affairs stated one in every nine people in Washington State is a Veteran. She stated the State Department of Veterans Affairs now has an Apprenticeship Coordinator position funded. This position will help with the transition from military into apprenticeship.
- Colonel H. Charles Hodges Jr. (Chuck), Commander, Joint Base Lewis-McChord stated that Joint Base Lewis-McChord is going to transition between 8,000 to 9,000 service members into the civilian sector over the next year. He went on to encourage apprenticeship programs to partner with him to market the benefits of doing an apprenticeship program.

Dacia Dunbar, WSDOT Apprentice Utilization Program, construction Division, spoke about House Bill 1595 this change is intended to broaden the consideration for apprenticeship and will now include workers beyond the physical site of work, consistent with the application of prevailing wage law for projects advertised on or after July 24, 2015.
