



APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS QUALIFICATIONS

CONSTRUCTION APPRENTICESHIP - 5 YEAR ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAM

The apprentice works under the direct supervision of a journeyman wireman. The scope of work covers the installation of electrical distribution centers, panel boards, side panels, conduit systems, motor controls, lighting, fire alarms, temporary wiring, etc. The above stated work pertains to any commercial or industrial buildings. All trainees must attend a minimum of 200 hours of NJATC classroom instruction per year. An additional 15 credits of approved Associate Degree classes must be completed prior to graduation.

SOUND AND COMMUNICATION – 3 YEAR PROGRAM

BICSI CERTIFIED TRAINER

The apprentice works under the supervision of a journeyman. The work covered shall include the installation, testing, service and maintenance of systems utilizing the transmission and/or transference of voice, sound, vision and digital for commercial, education, security and entertainment purposes. All trainees must attend a minimum of 200 hours of related classroom instruction per year and complete BICSI certification.

RESIDENTIAL TRAINEE - 2 YEAR PROGRAM

The trainee works under the direct supervision of a residential wireman. The scope of work covers the wiring of homes and small apartment houses not exceeding three stories, which includes electrical service, installation of romex and boxes, hook-up of ranges and other major appliances, receptacles, switches, lighting, electrical heat, heat pumps, etc. All trainees must attend a minimum of 200 hours of related classroom instruction per year.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

1. Must be at least 18 years of age. There is no upper age limit.
2. Must be a high school graduate or have a GED with a minimum of 250 points (2500 in the new scoring system) OR in lieu of a high school diploma, have a two-year Associate Degree or higher.
3. **Construction Electrician applicants** must show evidence of completion (with a “C” or better) of one full year of high school algebra or one post high school algebra course, or provide evidence of having completed the NJATC Online Tech Math Course with a minimum score of 75%. www.njatc.org. **Sound & Communication and Residential applicants** must show evidence of completion (with a “C” or better) of one year of high school basic math.
4. Possess and maintain a valid driver’s license.

We accept applications 24 hours a day via our website at www.psejatic.org. If necessary, you may use the computers in our office on weekdays between 9am and 3:00pm. Please allow about two hours for reading our Standards of Apprenticeship and completing paperwork. A \$42.00 application fee must be paid with a major credit card or debit card on the secure website.

All supporting documentation (sealed official high school and college transcripts; and, where applicable, GED with scores) must be submitted within 60 days of your application date to the PSEJATC office at: 550 SW 7th Street, Renton, WA 98057
