Proviso Overview

ESSB 5950 (Section 906) - Making 2023-2025 fiscal biennium supplemental operating appropriations

- This task force was created to study the nature and scope of the underground economy and recommend what policy changes, if any, are needed to address the underground economy within the construction industry and report their findings to the legislature.
- The proviso identifies the membership of the task force with appointments made by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House.
- The task force to choose the chair or co-chairs from among its membership at the initial meeting.
- Findings and recommendations are due to the legislature by June 30, 2025

Proviso Overview

ESSB 5950 (Section 906) - Making 2023-2025 fiscal biennium supplemental operating appropriations

- The task force shall study the nature and scope of the underground economy and recommend what policy changes, if any, are needed to address the underground economy, including whether greater cohesion and transparency among state agencies is needed.
- "Underground economy" means contracting and construction activities in which payroll is unreported or underreported with consequent nonpayment of payroll taxes to federal and state agencies including nonpayment of workers' compensation and unemployment compensation taxes.

Scope – What's in/out

Proviso directs:

- Contract and construction activity
- Unreported and underreported payroll and taxes
- Cohesion and transparency between state agencies
