# Guide to Medical Resources

This guide is designed to facilitate discussions with claim managers (CMs) regarding the need for a medical resource referral and the specific areas in which the resource can be helpful. If the CM agrees, they will initiate the request for ONC review.

# Unit Occupational Nurse Consultant (ONC)

- Understanding Medical Treatment Guidelines (MTGs)
- Reviews newly contended conditions and treatment recommendations per MTGs
- Reviews nicotine cessation treatment, obesity treatment, & mental health treatment
- Reviews Comagine recommendations and denials
- Partners with regional ONCs, nurse case managers, and Health Care Coordinators to focus on early recovery and return to work
- Authorize skilled nursing, attendant care, nurse case managers, residential care, and home health care (nursing, PT, OT)

# Office of the Medical Director (OMD) or Pharmacy Consultant

- Reviews protests to Utilization Review after peer-to-peer review
- Reviews unclear, causal relationships for newly contended conditions
- Addresses requested treatment not already addressed in MTGs
- Reviews Controlled Substance Concerns (Pharmacy Consultant)

### **Field Occupational Nurse Consultant**

- Onsite consultations and assessments, including accompanying VRCs to worker appointments
- Assists workers in finding medical providers in Washington, Idaho, and Oregon
- Provides support on complex claims (opioids, medical provider







issues, coverage requests, catastrophic claim initiation, work restrictions, transition of care)

#### Nurse Case Manager

- Coordinates medical treatment and addresses barriers
- Coordinates on complex, time-intensive claims
- Manages catastrophic injuries (frequent hospitalizations, secondary diagnoses complicating recovery, return-to-work plans, treatment plans)
- Coordinates care across multiple provider types
- Finds care for out of state/country workers
- On-site visits with out of state medical providers

# HSC/COHE

- Coordinates referrals with workers and providers
- Assesses barriers, including administering FRQs
- Assists with medication issues and transfer of care
- Coordinates surgical care
- Coordinates return-to-work plans
