

WISHA 10 for Agriculture Training of Trainers (TOT)



L&I's Division of Occupational Safety and Health offers this training to help seasoned and skilled agriculture personnel become certified to teach the WISHA 10 for Agriculture training.

About the TOT training:

- The training is taught over five days, 40 class hours, Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- There is no cost for the training.
- Offered at several locations statewide.

Who may apply?

The training is designed for personnel with at least five years of agriculture safety and health experience.

- Participants are required to first attend a WISHA 10 for Agriculture Workers training.
- Applications will be reviewed for applicable work experience and training.
