Since launch of the Conveyance Management Portal (CMP, Portal) on March 26, many of you have found the benefits of using the Portal. Here are some usage numbers as of May 1:

- 1,493 permits reviewed
- 2,007 payments made
- 727 annual operating certificates renewed online

We expect to make a report on the project at the <u>Elevator Safety Advisory Committee (ESAC)</u> <u>will meet May 20</u>, starting at 9 a.m. (Stakeholder meeting begins at 8 a.m.). We plan a short presentation on the project's completion, and some time to respond to questions.
