Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: The purpose of this rulemaking is to propose an increase to the electrical fees by the fiscal growth factor of 6.40 percent. The fee increase is the maximum allowed by the state Office of Financial Management for fiscal year 2025. This rulemaking also proposes removing the fee for printed copies of the electrical laws and rules. The Electrical Program will no longer be providing printed copies as electronic versions are available online for customers. Reasons supporting proposal: A fee increase is needed to support increased operating expenses for inspections and other Electrical Program services. The current fee levels are insufficient to cover current Electrical Program expenses. The fee increase is necessary to ensure that revenues match expenditures. Removing the fee for printed copies of the electrical laws and rules will ensure the rule is up-to-date and aligns with requirements.
