The [Washington State Department of Labor & Industries](#) (L&I) will hold a public hearing on the proposed amendments to the elevator rules and fees under [Chapter 296-96 WAC, SAFETY REGULATIONS AND FEES FOR ALL ELEVATORS, DUMBWAITERS, ESCALATORS AND OTHER CONVEYANCES](#). The purpose of the hearing is to receive public comment on the proposed amendments.

L&I performed a review of the rules that will update and clarify existing rules, increase fees, and make housekeeping and other changes.

A fee increase of 5.08% is needed to support operating expenses for inspections of conveyances and other elevator program public safety activities.
