Purpose: This emergency rulemaking delays the effective date of the 2020 edition of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 70, the National Electrical Code (NEC) under the state's electrical rules, until October 29, 2020. Due to the evolving public health emergency caused by the coronavirus (COVID-19), L&I is moving to respond to our customers' need to delay the implementation of the new safety codes.

EMERGENCY RULE

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.

Reasons for this finding: The emergency rule allows the 2017 NEC to remain in effect temporarily. This emergency rulemaking is necessary to delay the new safety codes, so businesses and consumers can focus on completing projects inprogress without having to navigate a new regulatory system, during a time when many businesses have closed or greatly reduced their operations and must meet new safety requirements due to the pandemic.
