For purposes of apprenticeship, service work excludes construction, alteration, repair or improvement on public works projects as referred to in 39.04.010, but includes maintenance when performed by contract.

Further, the Council directs the Department to flag the 'service work alone' entries that currently exist in standards as variances to WAC 296-05-316(5).
