# **New Sponsors Participating in WG-A**

Apprentices at Atarashii Apprenticeship Program and Spokane Heat and Frost Insulators and Allied Workers Apprenticeship Committee are now able to apply for financial assistance through the WA Grant for Apprenticeship (WG-A) Program using ANEW (a third-party servicer). The two new Sponsors join AJAC Advanced Manufacturing Apprenticeships and Evergreen Rural Water of Washington (ERWoW) for a total of four apprenticeship Sponsors participating in WG-A. WSAC anticipates additional Sponsors coming onboard in the next several weeks also utilizing ANEW.

#### Applying to Participate in WG-A

WSAC has revised the application process for state-registered apprenticeship Sponsors under chapter 49.04 RCW, who want to participate in the WG-A program using ANEW as a third-party servicer. Policies, procedures, and financial statements are no longer required for Sponsors utilizing ANEW. ### **Modifications to WG-A Satisfactory Program Progress**

A full WG-A annual award is tied to a standard of 2,000 hours of On-the-Job Training (OJT) and 144 hours of Related Supplemental Instruction (RSI). WSAC will be allowing for Satisfactory Program Progress to be met by apprentices who complete a minimum of 1,340 OJT hours and a minimum of 96 RSI hours to allow apprentices more flexibility based on availability of work.

### Recently Passed Legislation Related to WG-A

### **Washington College Grant Lifetime Eligibility Expansion**

The Legislature passed <u>Senate Bill 5904</u>, which will extend eligibility under the Washington College Grant programs, including WG-A, from five years (or 125% of the published length of a program) to six years (or 150% of the published length of a program). The legislation will be effective July 1, 2024.

# **Native American Apprentice Assistance Program**

The Legislature also passed <u>House Bill 2019</u>, effective in Fiscal Year 2025, establishing a Native American apprentice grant assistance program to be administered by WSAC. WSAC will be developing the program through engagement with tribes and state-registered apprenticeship programs. This apprenticeship assistance program is separate from WG-A.
