## VI. RATIO OF APPRENTICES TO JOURNEY LEVEL WORKERS:

<u>1.</u> For purposes of clarity, the ratio will mean one apprentice for the first skilled journey-person at the job site, and one additional apprentice for each additional skilled journey-person employed thereafter, at the job site.

2. Provided proper documented permission has been granted by the Committee, an apprentice in his/her fifth year of apprenticeship, defined as 8,000 OJT hours and above, and who's provided valid proof of passing the state journey-level sprinkler fitter certification, will be permitted to work alone on any part of any job site or project that employs one, (1), or more Journey-Level Worker(s), and as far as possible, be allowed to assume the responsibilities of a Journey-Level Worker in order to gain this necessary and relevant experience.
