

I. GEOGRAPHIC AREA COVERED

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Clallam, Clark, Cowlitz, Grays Harbor, Island, Jefferson, King, Kitsap, Lewis, Mason, Pacific, Pierce, San Juan, Skagit, Skamania, Snohomish, Thurston, Wahkiakum and Whatcom counties with headquarters in DuPont and Everett and DuPont, Washington.

II. MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

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Minimum qualifications for HVAC Controls Technician, HVAC Service Technician, HVAC Test, Adjust and Balance Technician, Sheet Metal Worker Apprentices:

Physical: Must be able to perform the rigorous manual labor required by the trade, with or without reasonable ~~assistance~~ accommodations, and have the ability to work safely at high elevations. Physical ability must be confirmed by attending a minimum qualification screening day or verification of prior work experience in the Sheet Metal or related industry, as determined by the committee.

Minimum Qualifications for Marine Sheet Metal Worker Apprentices:

Physical: Must be able to perform the rigorous manual labor required by the trade, with or without reasonable ~~assistance~~ acomodations, and have a natural ability to work safely at high elevations. Physical ability must be confirmed by attending a minimum qualification screening day or verification of prior work experience in the Sheet Metal or related industry, as determined by the Committee.

Minimum Qualifications for Residential Sheet Metal Worker Apprentices:

Physical: Must be able to perform the rigorous manual labor required by the trade, with or without reasonable ~~assistance~~ acomodations, and have a natural ability to work safely at high elevations. Physical ability must be confirmed by attending a minimum qualification screening day or verification of prior work experience in the Sheet Metal or related industry, as determined by the Committee.

III. CONDUCT OF PROGRAM UNDER WASHINGTON EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY PLAN:

A.1.h. All Western Washington Sheet Metal JATC qualified applicants accepted into the program and not currently participating in the Sheet Metal Anti-Drug Program are required to pass a pre-employment drug test (paid for by WWSMJATC) with negative test results. Applicants failing the drug test will be removed from the ranked eligibility list upon proper notification and must wait a minimum of 60 days before submitting another application.
