


## **Report to the Washington State Apprenticeship & Training Council**

## **Apprenticeship Enrollments**

There are currently 22 colleges with 179 active apprenticeship programs. During the winter quarter only 19 colleges had actual enrollment in their active programs. The headcount for apprentices in the winter quarter of 2021 was 7,064 (winter of 2012 was 9,237), representing a decrease of 23.52% from 2020. In a comparison of the FTES for winter quarter 2021 to winter quarter 2020, the data shows a decrease of 20.99% in FTES. This marks the sixth quarter that there has not been a growth in apprenticeship enrollments, following twenty-six consecutive quarters of growth. To put the current numbers in perspective, winter enrollment is slightly above our spring enrollment in 2017 (7,021).

## <u>Apprenticeship RSI – Trade Review committee Recommendation</u>

The State Board for Community and Technical Colleges (SBCTC) conducted a Related Supplemental Instruction (RSI) review, lead by the RSI Review Committee on June 24, 2021 (following the rules set forth in WAC 296-05-317). The RSI review included apprenticeship standards with RSI plans for seven occupations. A transcript of the meeting communication with attendees participating in the review was provided to the Department as a part of the committee recommendation.

  - a. Mechanical Insulator, 47-2132.00, 10,000 Hours
- 4. **Approval**, as submitted of the standard from Ena'Vative Hair Studio Apprenticeship Program for:

Cosmetologist, 39-5012.00, 3,000 Hours

5. Approval, as submitted of the standard from Texture Apprenticeship Program for:

- a. Cosmetologist, 39-5012.00, 3,000 Hours
- 6. Approval, as submitted of the standard from Northwest Maritime Apprenticeship for:
  - a. Marine Service Technician, 49-3051.00, 6,000 Hours
- 7. **Approval**, as submitted of the standard from Washington Public School Classified Employees Apprenticeship Committee adding the new occupation:
  - a. Paraeducator III, 25-2021.00, 6,000 Hours
