

Report to the Washington State Apprenticeship and Training Council

Summary

This report, representing only about 75% of our system, continues to demonstrate a strong commitment towards maximizing local partnering, supporting outreach activities, enhanced consumer, and business navigation, and participating in the development of registered apprenticeship programs across the state of Washington. The activities reported here continue to provide impressive evidence that our WorkSource system is highly committed and invested in helping to advance and expand registered apprenticeship.

Comments: Cascade Veterinary Clinics (CVC) program standards for the LVT and VA occupations were approved at the October 21, 2022 WSATC meeting as new standards with provisional status and three apprentices have begun since January 9. The VBOG (Veterinary Board of Governor's) voted on March 6, 2023 to finalize the language for the CR101 for the rulemaking process to make registered apprenticeship an explicit pathway in the RCW for a LVT to sit for the national exam (VTNE). The rulemaking was published for public comment and reviewed by the VBOG. On 6.12.23, the VBOG voted 5-3 to submit a CR 102 rulemaking packet with an anticipated hearing in September 2023 which continues to move the rulemaking forward. On December 4, the VBOG discussed the public comments which heavily favored Cascade Vet (600+ in support with 30 in opposition). The vote to approve the CR102 passed 5-3 at the March 4, 2024 meeting.

As of May 12, after a lengthy three-year litigious obstacle, a registered apprenticeship program became *officially* approved as a post-secondary pathway to qualify for licensure exams as a vet tech thanks to the dedication of Cascade Vet Clinics (CVC) in Wenatchee, East Wenatchee and Leavenworth. Previously, the opportunity to sit for the licensed vet tech certification was only possible after

completing a two-year certificate program at a handful of colleges in the state. With registered apprenticeships now clarified as an approved pathway, more qualified candidates will be able to fill veterinary technician and assistant job vacancies and provide essential care to Washington State pets!

The State and National Veterinary Associations brought a lawsuit naming the WSATC, VBOG, and Cascade Veterinary Clinics to stop the rulemaking process and the continuation of the program because they oppose registered apprenticeship as a pathway to sit for the Veterinary Technician National Exam (a requirement to practice as a Licensed Vet Tech in WA State). The VTNE does allow registered apprenticeship as a pathway. At the December 15, 2023 Superior Court hearing in Thurston County, the motions were dismissed. The Associations continue to appeal this decision.
