- Leave plenty of space when behind a motorcycle.





	9/19/24: CR101 filed in August for Co-recording and Third-party recording pilot rules. Listening sessions held. Draft language shared Oct 10. Co-recording rules anticipated to file in December. Third-party recording pilot estimate to last 6 months.			
Large addendum Requests	5/22/25: firms shared concerns with large addendum requests associated with state fund claims and fraud investigations. Current reimbursement rate of \$168.19 is a global fee (file review included). Department is exploring payment options to address the extra amount of time it takes for examiners to review new records. One option is quantifying # of pages included in the fee reimbursement and allowing billing of 1129M (Extensive File Review) for pages after set threshold.  L&I met with CSP on fraud investigator requests and explored ways to improve processes. Additional engagement expected to scope questions being asked of examiners and to refine scope of future requests.			













# **Relevant Legislation**

- HB 1197 (RCW 51.08.200)
  - The intent of the legislation is to allow psychologists to serve as Attending Providers and to improve access to treatment in claims solely for mental health conditions

- Effective date: July 1, 2025
  - Applies retroactively

- <u>51.32.090</u> Temporary total disability—Partial restoration of earning power—Return to available work—When employer continues wages—Limitations—Finding—Rules
- 51.32.095 Vocational rehabilitation services—Benefits—Priorities—Allowable costs—Performance criteria
- <u>51.36.010</u> Findings—Minimum standards for providers—Health care provider network—Advisory group—Best practices treatment guidelines—Extent and duration of treatment—Centers for occupational health and education—Rules—Reports
- <u>51.36.022</u> Residence modification assistance—Rules—Report to legislature
- <u>51.36.060</u> Duties of attending provider—Medical information

# **Rulemaking Timeline**

- Filed CR-102 January 21, 2025
- Rules public hearing February 26, 2025
- File CR-103 Adopting final language
  - Will be filed May 20, 2025
  - Rules will be effective July 1, 2025

# What Do Psychologists Need to Do?

- Psychologists must join the Medical Provider Network on or before June 30, 2025.
- They can opt to serve as Attending Providers on solely mental health claims.
  - Per RCW 296.23.317, no IME or impairment ratings can be performed by psychologists.

# Who Can Perform Psychiatric IMEs?

 Only psychiatrists (MD/DO) can perform psychiatric IMEs in Washington State and in our workers' compensation system.


 Psychologists are permitted to perform psychiatric IMEs in multiple other states.

# MARFS Chapter 17: Mental Health and Behavioral Health Interventions

- Inclusion of mental health, behavioral health, and PGAP (Progressive Goal Attainment Program)
- Clarification of the billing requirements and updated time limits for psychological and neuropsychological evaluation services
- New tables to add clarification in other areas
- Mental health facilities and telehealth have been moved to different chapters

# Trauma Exposure and PTSD: A Brief Overview



## **Additional Important DSM-5 Criteria**

Symptom duration is more than 1 month

 Symptoms cause clinically significant distress or impairment in social, occupational, or other important areas of function

## **How Is the Diagnosis Typically Made?**

- Clinical diagnostic interview
- Diagnostic measures Gold standard structured clinical interview administered by a trained mental health professional
  - Clinician-Administered PTSD Scale for DSM-5 (CAPS-5)
  - PTSD Symptom Scale Interview for DSM-5 (PSS-I-5)
  - Structured Clinical Interview for the DSM-5 (SCID PTSD Module)

# **PTSD Relevant Projects**

## PTSD Survey and Jurisdictional Review

**Deliverable Description:** An external contractor/vendor will assess PTSD workers' compensation benefits, policies, coverage, and findings on PTSD prevention projects and produce a detailed report for L&I.

**Success Criteria:** The vendor report meaningfully informs future strategies for L&I PTSD policies, benefits, and claim management processes and assists in the completion of a required report to the legislature.

**Current Status:** Workstream team, sponsors, and subject matter experts have reviewed and provided comments on an initial draft report submitted by vendor.

**Next Steps:** Additional review and comment with final acceptance of the vendor report by mid-May. Engage the vendor to assist, if needed and as appropriate, in the completion of the draft L&I PTSD Report to the Legislature.

L&I submits report to the legislature by June 30, 2025.

# **Data Collection and Report Production**

**Deliverable Description:** Define and standardize the data elements needed to appropriately identify PTSD claims and produce needed reports

**Success Criteria:** Identified the needed data elements and have a reproducible plan to produce the needed reports

**Current Status:** Data elements defined to appropriately identify PTSD claims, and standardized report was built with clear data definitions

#### **Next Steps:**

- Finalize the report with Research and Data Services (RDS)
- Complete first quarter reporting for January 2025 through March 2025. Make adjustments as needed
- Finalize the report out process
- Target Completion date: July 2025

# PTSD Clinical Guideline Development

- The Industrial Insurance Medical Advisory Committee (IIMAC) PTSD subcommittee
  has met monthly since August, 2024 and is on track to have clinical guidelines
  developed by Fall, 2025.
- Among questions we plan to answer:
  - What are gold standard diagnostic tools that can assist in limiting over- or underdiagnosing?
  - What are the best way(s) to screen for PTSD and to track symptoms over time?
  - Which evidence informed treatments are recommended?
  - What does an appropriate treatment course and outcome(s) look like for the traumaexposed (work-related) workers we serve
    - Duration of treatment, types of treatment
    - Potential need for escalation of treatment, second opinion, evaluation, or even Centers of Excellence
- Easy to understand, credible within community and providers


# Workers' Compensation Advisory Committee: PTSD Subcommittee

- Membership includes internal and external stakeholders
  - L&I leadership
  - Labor and business representatives
- We have had quarterly meetings since June, 2024.
- Members recognize the impact of PTSD on claimants, their families, and costs to the system.
- Collaborative discussions on opportunities for best outcomes.

# **IME Recording Update**



## IME Recording Implementation Update

- RCW 51.36.070 effective 7/1/23, giving workers the right to record IMEs
- External partners disagree on examiner ability to co-record resulting in delays and/or inability to schedule exams
- Department proposed rules to address concerns around co-recording
- External feedback did not support moving forward with co-recording rule

## Mitigation measures...

 Department is conducting a Third Party Recording Pilot to explore whether offering a secure third party recording service reduces the delays resulting from cancelation and rescheduling of IMEs when a worker chooses to record.

#### Note:

- Workers may opt to use this service in lieu of using their own device to record
- ☐ Examiners may use service if a worker affirmatively agrees to co-recording
- Pilot will help inform any future rulemaking efforts or changes to IME policies.

## **IME Third Party Recording Pilot**

- L&I has contracted with a vendor to provide a 3<sup>rd</sup> party recording service (Medical Memory).
- We will assess if both parties are willing to use a 3<sup>rd</sup> party recording service.
- 6 months: 3/1/25 through 8/31/25
- Any worker wishing to record can use the service
- Available for co-recording (for those instances when worker still would like to do their own recording)

#### **Desired Outcomes...**

- Reduction in the delays resulting from cancellation and rescheduling of IMEs when a worker chooses to record.
- Less risk and administrative burden associated with maintaining multiple recordings of same exam.
- Workers may opt to use this service in lieu of using their own device to record and make examiner co-recording unnecessary.
- Mitigates concerns around chain of custody, storage security, and misuse of recordings.
- Inform any future rulemaking efforts or changes to IME policies.

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Recording Flow

 No fewer than 7 days prior to the exam Worker notifies firm Worker asked by firm if interested in using 3<sup>rd</sup> of intent to record Party Recording Service Worker and examiner both Exam Recorded agree to use of 3rd party recording using The Medical · Verbal consent obtained at start of Memory exam recording Worker Provided information sheet on obtaining access to view recording



Pause & resume the video if needed.

AppStore Tap Save when done.

Video instantly begins to uploaded.



Tap stop then Send

## **Measuring Impact**

- <u>Utilization</u>: Did access to third party recording improve access to IME providers?
  - Completion rate
  - Referral success rate
- <u>Timeliness</u>:
  - Duration of IME referrals when recording requested






- 121 recordings using 3<sup>rd</sup> party

- 3 firms currently using (CSP, ExamWorks, MES)
- Authenticated 46 devices
- No workers have requested to view recording
- Outreach to broaden awareness of pilot




## More analysis ...

- Validating data on IME completion rate and duration time between referral and exam
- Recording quality
- Please enter worker claim number in Medical Memory App prior to pushing record
- Assess pilot in July-stop, extend, make service permanent


#### WordBridge Interpretation Services


