Subject of possible rule making: Implementation of Engrossed House Bill 1756 (Chapter 304, Laws of 2019) - Adult Entertainers--Safety and Security/RCW 49.17.470; WAC 296-800-140, Accident prevention program,

Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject: Chapter 49.17 RCW, RCW 49.17.470

Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish: This rulemaking will implement the requirements of Engrossed House Bill 1756 (Chapter 304, Laws of 2019) codified under RCW 49.17.470. Specifically, this rulemaking will address the following:

- The requirement that adult entertainment establishment provide panic buttons in certain locations;
- The requirement that adult entertainment establishments record accusations of customer violence, including assault, sexual assault, or sexual harassment, towards an entertainer; and
- The requirement that the adult entertainment establishments ban customers for three years if an accusation of violence or harassment by a customer is supported by a statement made under penalty of perjury or other evidence.
