Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: The Division of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH) initiated this rulemaking to update how the base penalties are calculated in order to make penalties more effective and address concerns raised through the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) State Activities Mandated Measures (SAMM) report that Washington penalties continue to be below the national average. OSHA uses the SAMM report to determine whether State Plans are as effective as OSHA.

The proposed changes include:

- The base penalty rate will be adjusted for inflation every year based on the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U).
- The base penalty amount may also be increased by an additional 2 percent if DOSH is not within 25 percent of the national penalty average determined by OSHA.
- Numbering definitions to aid in education and research.
- Removing the terms "you" and "we" and replacing with "employee" and "employer" to provide clarity.
- Removing the term "Washington Industrial Safety and Health Act" or "WISHA" and replacing with "DOSH" where the term is meant to refer to DOSH.
- Removing outdated fax number information.
