


Truck Driver: A Deadly Occupation¹

Washington State Fatality Assessment and Control Evaluation (FACE)² 2010–2019

Five Occupations with the Most Worker Deaths³



Location and Incident Type⁴ for Truck Driver Deaths



More truck drivers died on the job than workers in any other occupation.

- 14% of all workers who died on the job were truck drivers.
- Over half of truck drivers died in motor vehicle crashes while inside their trucks (n=55).
- 39% of truck drivers died while outside of their trucks (n=36):
 - 14 were struck by other vehicles.
 - o 6 were rolled over or into by their own trucks.
