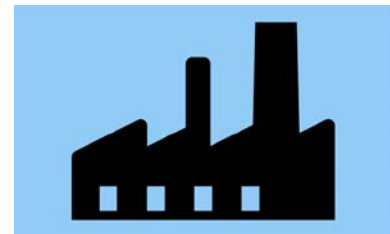
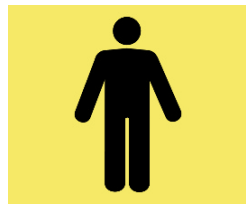
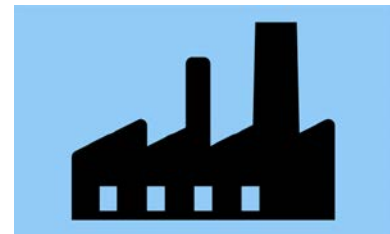
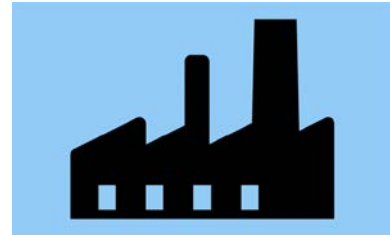
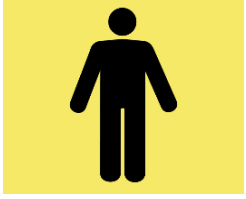
# Importance of Industry *and* Occupation

Why do we need information on both?

1. More complete description of person's work
  - Better identify work-related risks
2. Helps with coding the data
  - Translate text to codes for analysis

What if a person has more than 1 job?

- Record all jobs
  - Main job first (most hours worked)

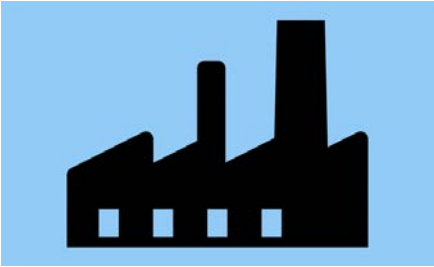

## Too general

“Food”

“Office”

## More descriptive ✓

Hospital  
Nursing Home  
Home Health Care

Truck transportation  
Mass transit

Hotel  
Restaurant  
Travel agency

Food manufacturing  
Agriculture crop production  
Restaurant

Doctor’s office  
Law office  
Accounting office

# Summary

## Occupation

- The kind of work a person does to earn a living

## Industry

- The type of business or organization in which a person works

## If multiple jobs

- Start with main job. Record all.

## Be brief

- 2-3 words usually sufficient

## Be specific

- Avoid general, vague terms

## Be descriptive

- Clear description of job duties, business
